

Annual Conference Report June 10 -13, 2019 Theme: Bearing Fruit that Lasts COMMITTED



Returning to Lakeside for my fifteenth year was again a spiritual experience. The worship services, the music, the people, and the setting all make the fact that this is a business conference a wonderful way to spend my time. Bob and I witnessed Pastor Bob participate in the worship service for retiring pastors. It was a spiritual service

with beautiful music and an inspirational message. There were a total of 35 men and women who, when combined, equaled 868 years of service. They may have retired from their conference appointments, but Bishop Malone is certain God will have them continue serving in some other way.

The rain and the water level of Lake Erie were topics that just about everyone discussed. Then there was the topic of the decision from The Way Forward Commission regarding the LGBTQ members and friends of our denomination. While everyone could agree the rain needed to stop and the lake water needed to recede, there was not the same consensus with the vote which took place in February of this past year. It was evident to me of a division in our conference. With over 1400 Clergy and Lay Delegates in attendance, when votes were taken on resolutions or petitions that dealt with the topic, it was impossible to get a 2/3 majority. Most vote totals were very close to 50/50.

The one phrase that I heard many times each day from many different speakers was: "God loves you." We are each a child of God and Jesus commanded us to love each other. I leave you to ponder the connotation.

In business sessions we spent much of the time voting for Jurisdictional and General Conference Delegates (as well as Alternates). This also is where the division showed up very clearly. A list of "suggested" candidates was given for the "liberals" and a list was given for the "conservatives." I could feel the tension in the auditorium as the results were given for each ballot. Through this whole process Bishop Malone was calm, polite, respectful, diplomatic, and reminded us often that we were connected by our faith in Jesus Christ. She led us in prayer quite frequently and had others lead us in prayer prior to each ballot. A delegation for each upcoming conference and the alternates was elected.

Other business news included the following information:

*The trucks for the Midwest Distribution Center were leaving Lakeside with more than \$12,000 in cash donations; 850 cleaning buckets, 750 hygiene kits, 540 school kits, 1325 personal dignity kits, 135 baby palettes, 300 homemade hospital gowns, and medical supplies. Our conference members know Jesus.

*Church membership numbers, and attendance numbers continue to decline.

*Small group participation (not Sunday School) and persons serving in mission/community ministries **increased**. PTL

*Five churches from 5 different districts closed this past year.

*The conference is aware of the struggle many churches have in paying their shared ministries obligation. About 68% of churches paid 100% of their required amount, while over 250 churches were able to pay more, so the conference was able to pay out about 83%. We must realize we are a connectional church. We must once again be one of the churches who fulfills their obligation to the conference. We must all work together to make that happen. The East Ohio Conference was able to once again, pay 100% of their shared ministries obligation to the General Conference.

As we begin a new conference year with Pastor Bob Spaulding let us all pray for God to pour out His blessings upon us and lead us on His path. Pray that we will be able to: fulfill our conference obligations; participate in growing in our faith through Sunday School, Bible Study, and worship; follow our calling to help in the community; and be the hands and feet of Jesus. We are a Called, Committed, and Connected people. Through Jesus Christ we are to go into the mission field to make disciples of Jesus for the transformation of the world.
