

Dr. Frank Rogers Jr., a professor at Claremont School of Theology in southern California, spent

several years working with young people in the inner city areas of Los Angeles County. He encouraged teens to tell their stories.

His program was so successful that on one occasion he was asked to be the keynote speaker at a gathering of clergy in Palm Springs. Renting an old bus, he set out with a small group of teens and headed for the conference.

With Route 10 stretching out before them, they got a flat tire right in the middle of a desert. Fortunately, there was a spare, but unfortunately, no jack.

Standing by the side of the road, Dr. Rogers attempted to flag down several cars — three of which were driven by none other than some of the big shots of the church conference at which he was speaking.

Then a rattletrap of a rusty pickup passed by. It was full of migrant workers. The vehicle rolled to a stop and the migrants poured out. They quickly found a jack, changed the tire and refused any kind of payment.

As they piled back in the truck, Dr. Rogers asked the kids: "Did you see what happened here?" They replied: "Yes! We have a story."

Arriving a bit late at the conference, Dr. Rogers related the story to the crowded hall, with the students acting out the scene behind him.

The bishop came quickly forward and said, "Mea culpa. I didn't know you were one of us."

One of the teens quickly replied, "You are missing the point. There is no us."

And Dr. Rogers completed the thought with this:

"We are all on the side of the road. We need each other to get where we want to go." —Melanie Silva
