





UPDATE FROM TREASURER AS OF JANUARY 31, 2023

I have completed the Financial Statement for the period ending JANUARY 31, 2023.

The following figures are drawn from that report.

GENERAL FUND BUDGETED RECEIPTS:	\$10,740
(\$254 greater than last year.)	
GENERAL FUND EXPENSES:	5,308
(\$860 less than last year.)	
GENERAL FUND INCOME AT 1/31/23:	5,432
GENERAL FUND BALANCE AT 1/31/23:	11,521
GENERAL FUND BALANCE AT 1/31/22:	12,285

Total pledged, non-pledged and loose plate giving of \$10, 740 in January 2023 was greater than the prior year by \$254. The total received in January in both years is almost double what we anticipate each month for the remainder of the year. This happens because one pledge made in January is for the entire year.

Total general fund expenses totaling \$5,308 were less than prior year by \$860. The reduction in expenses is mainly because no apportionments were paid this year. Apportionments were paid last year until the month of October. Due to declining revenues and financial projections, Administrative Council decided to discontinue paying apportionments in October 2022.

The forecast I did for 2023 based on the 2023 budget and on the January receipts and disbursements resulted in a small profit. It is really too early in the year to know whether this will actually occur. I will be doing monthly analysis to

try to determine a trend and issue a monthly update.


Lent began on Ash Wednesday ~ February 22

Top Ten List: THINGS YOU CAN TRY FOR THE LENTEN SEASON

- **10. Try an electronic fast.** Give up TV, Guitar Hero, texting, tweeeting, e-mail and all things electronic for one day every week. (or everyday of Lent!) Use the time to read & pray.
- **9. Start a prayer rhythm.** Say a prayer every time you brush your teeth, hear an ambulance, or check your e-mail. Before you text someone, pray for them.
- **8. Read one chapter in the Bible each day.** (Matthew's a good book to start with. Psalms, too.)
- 7. Forgive someone who doesn't deserve it (maybe even yourself.)
- **6. Give up soft drinks, fast food, tea or coffee.** Give the money you save to help folks in crisis or disaster.
- **5. Create a daily quiet time.** Spend 30 minutes a day in silence and prayer.
- **4. Cultivate a life of gratitude.** Write someone a thank you letter each week and be aware of how many people have helped you along the way.
- 3. Be kind to someone each day.
- **2. Pray for others you see** as you walk to and from classes or drive to and from work.
- **1. Volunteer one hour or more each week** with a local shelter, tutoring program, nursing home, prison ministry or a Habitat for Humanity project.
